### Library Budget Approved by Board of Supervisors with a Bonus

The efforts made by the various Friends groups, librarians, staff and current Library Director Derek Wolfgram paid off on June 26 at the Annual Budget hearings before the county Board of Supervisors.

Several individuals, including our president Macy Kelly, spoke before the Board to sell the need for at least level if not expanded funding for the county library system. The Board approved the request and added another \$200,000 to the pot. These additional funds are to be shared by all of the branches within the system.
