Chico Historian to be Annual Guest Speaker



Noted local historian and "fact sheet" Michele Shover will deliver the annual guest lecture at the CFOL Annual

Meeting on May 18th in the library community room of the public library at Sherman and 1st Avenue.

Dr. Shrover taught Political Science at Chico State University for 38 years, serving as Chairperson for part of her tenure. Her 2005 book *Exploring Chico's Past And Other Essays* is a collection of local history . Michele is an excellent speaker and if you have a question about Chico history, she has the answer.

Betty was also responsible for updating the plaque in the library community room saluting donors who have given substantial monetary contributions to the Friends.

Wife of Professor Allan Forbes and mother to two daughters, Mary Ann Michelon of Napa and Jennifer Macarthy of Chico; four grandchildren, Katie and Matthew Michelon and Alaina and Logan Macarthy, Betty was an example for all to follow.

She was kind and considerate and her dry wit was a joy. She personified the term "service" when working at the circulation desk, always making library patrons feel welcome and at ease.

As one staff member at the library suggested to the editor of this newsletter, that "if Betty isn't in heaven then the rest of us don't stand a chance."

RECAP OF FUNDING ACTIVITIES
