Building a Community of Readers

That's what the library—and the summer library program in particular—does. Over the last few months, Chico Friends of the Library has helped to bring Chicoans together around the pleasure of books and reading.

With the enthusiastic program theme "Reading is Sooooooo Delicious," it was hard not to enjoy summer at the library. Young people led the way, with over seven hundred participating in library activities, building their reading skills and finding new favorite books.


Kids and teens borrowed about 35,000 books during school vacation—cookbooks, comic books, animal tales, scary stories, new series novels, how-to manuals and everything else under the hot Chico sun. Children love the freedom of summer, including the chance to choose books based on their own interests, not those of the school curriculum! About one third of CFOL's summer book purchases went to fill the arms and minds of these eager young library users.

Many kids and teens came to the library to browse books with friends. They also came to look at the gorgeous photos submitted to the young adult photography contest. This year's task was to prepare and photograph any kind of food; picture submissions ranged from book-themed cakes, to an abstract pattern of carrot-tops, to bacon dripping with syrup.

Judging was tough, especially due to the appetite it roused in the volunteers and staff! This year's top prize went to Wesley Churchill. His photo of a watermelon frog garnered him a new Kindle e-reader, courtesy of CFOL (see photo).

Funds from CFOL brought some fantastic performers to Chico for special events. The enduring popularity of the Wild Things animal show spilled over to the Hooker Oak school auditorium where hundreds of families gathered to meet a kangaroo, a tarantula, a serval kitten, and other unusual guests.
