
The Year in Review



This newsletter is all about encouraging you to renew your annual membership. President Diane Friedman has addressed that in her front page column. You may know that being a Friend is a good thing to do to support the library, but you might wonder <u>exactly</u> what do the Friends do?

Here's a summary of the 2014 Friends' activities and contributions:

- Held 48 weekly Saturday morning book sales (the volunteers get a few holidays!) that generate almost all the funds (\$50,000+ per year) the Friends give back to the library as you will see below.
- Held 12 "First Friday" afternoon book sales for Friends' members only. Nearly 40 new members joined to take advantage of First Friday sales!
- Purchased a state-of-the-art microfilm reader with printer for the public to use.
- Purchased a disc-cleaning machine, a desktop lectern speaker, 4 more Kindle ebook readers and books to go with, magazine covers, and new book carts.
- Paid for all programs for children during the Summer Library Program.
- Upgraded the display case in adult area.
- Donated \$\$\$ for Little Free Libraries, for a Teen Photo Contest prize, for library improvement projects, for

a movie licensing fee for Chico Branch, and for a Veteran's information kiosk and computer.

- Events sponsored or supported by the Friends included the annual children's bookmark contest, Annual Meeting program with author Erin McCabe, Fall Festival, Authors' Night, Trivia Bee Team, Magician Wayne Houchin, and holiday "Buy the Book" gifts for the library.
- Chico Friends of the Library received gifts and donations in the amount of nearly \$18,000; \$12,788 of this amount came from Annie B's drive.
- Donations to the library itemized above total nearly \$40,000. In addition, the Friends bought approximately \$30,000 in new books, \$1500 in periodicals, and \$500 in digital media.

That's what the Friends of the Library do—thanks to dedicated book sale volunteers and board members.



Also, CFOL has spent \$33,058.71 on the purchase of new books, digital media, and magazine subscriptions; a handsome increase from years \$23,080.03 spending. Book sale volunteers, patron donations, and book sale customers make this happen!
