

The design for the Chico Branch Library Maker Space is complete. There will be two connected areas each 20.6 feet square. One of the sections will contain the various items to use in the space, such as 3-D printers, a button maker, sewing machines, typewriters, and the Ellison diecut machine. The second space will be for Maker overflow and separate programming. What types of programming? It will be used for tutoring, book discussion, Fandom Club, computer lab and whatever else the staff and community envision.

Two county departments, General Services and Probation, will cooperate on assembling the maker space walls. The Chico Friends will purchase the materials as well as storage cabinets and work surfaces for inside. Currently General Services is pricing the materials for the project. The anticipated date to begin construction is May 2017. If there is a tool or process you would like to use in the new space, please email the branch or come tell us your idea.

### Welcome to the LFL system!

A Little Free Library (LFL) is a "take a book, return a book" free exchange. LFLs are located in a variety of settings, from public parks to store fronts. Often shaped like little houses, set on a post or mounted on a building wall, each holds a few dozen books. Little Free Libraries are an international effort, with over 50,000 registered LFLs in the United States. Butte County Library currently sponsors about a dozen LFLs in Chico. A steward connected with each LFL monitors books and maintenance needs. I am the steward for the LFL located at the




Cohasset store. The storeowners have been generous in sharing their property and support. I try to go by weekly and check on the books, filling or exchanging as needed. I try to keep a variety of books, and notice if a book sits too long without use. A wide selection of books donated to the library and the CFOL book sale are shelved in the back room of the library for stewards to choose as refills for the LFLs. It is anticipated that after a few months each LFL will be more or less refilling itself with community donations.

The LFLs are collaboration between the community, CFOL, and the Butte County Library. They enable neighborhoods and communities, like Cohasset, to access books without long drives to a public library, a valuable time saving. In Cohasset's case, that drive is about 15 miles.
