We had a good fiscal 2018-2019! Our regular income (membership and library services) was \$113,159, including \$71,028 from book sales alone! Our total spending was \$113,933 (books and other material, library programs, computers and library remodels). In addition to our regular income, we had two generous memorial donations from library lovers, which will help us to help the library with its long-term growth goals.

Books in good saleable condition are sorted by size onto a table where they will be priced, dotted, and packed into boxes by volunteers. A colored dot on the spine indicates the month the book was put on sale.

New books in good condition are added to the library collection.







High-value books go to the Internet sales volunteer.

Art books and coffee table books are set aside for "Rosa's table."

Mass-market paperbacks in pristine condition go to the 50¢ rack in foyer. Good paperbacks are boxed for the sale.

Duplicates or excess stock are donated to book sales at other libraries, to shelters and programs in need of books, or may be sold to other outlets.





Books that are in poor condition or are outdated (medical, financial, etc.) go to the recycle bin.

Children's books, magazines, music CDs, DVDs or videotapes, audiobooks, and sheet music are all processed separately. Other special categories are large-print, cookbooks, gardening, crafts, travel books, classics, reference, and best-selling authors.





Weekly book sale occurs on Saturday morning from 9:00 to 11:30. The monthly "First Friday" sale (2-4 p.m.) is open to CFOL members only.



Books are stored until Friday when the book sale is set up in the meeting room.







After the sale, books that have been in the sale at least three

months go on sale at a reduced price in the foyer.

Unsold books are donated elsewhere or recycled.

With a free library card, you have borrowing privileges and access to online resources at all Butte County branch libraries -- storehouses of knowledge, full of opportunities for academic achievement and lifelong learning.

Applications for library cards (in English and Spanish) are available at library branches and online). Young people's (ages 0-17) applications must be signed by a parent or legal guardian. Adults must present ID and address verification. A Teacher's Advantage Pass is available for enhanced borrowing privileges for Butte County educators.

After you get a card, you can place holds and renew items online, and have electronic access to resources like e-books.

During September the lost card replacement fee of \$1.00 is waived.
