Looking forward to another good year for our members, the library and the community. Thank you for your support!


CFOL Sponsors Children's Book Presentation







- If you use the online form, be sure and put the recipient's information in the form, but put your own information in the "note" box. When signing into Paypal, use your own credentials. Your donation is tax deductible.

Membership begins at \$20 and includes the right to shop at the members-only First Friday book sales every month. And you will have (besides a possible tax deduction) that warm holiday feeling, knowing that you have given a valued gift as well as supported your Chico branch library.

News from the Book Sale and the New Blue Boxes

CFOL has a new partner,

Discover Books, to handle excess unsold books from the Book Sale, helping us keep books out of the recycle bin!

The new blue boxes by the library's service door hold books that we have not been able to sell in



three months, but which are in good condition and may still be useful to other readers. Discover Books empties the boxes periodically, then distributes them regionally by selling books online, donating them to schools and literacy programs, and recycling as necessary.

The blue boxes are not for your donations. If you have books or other media to donate, please give them to us in the usual way. Small amounts (a bag or two) can be deposited on the donations cart inside the library. We take large donations (several boxes or bags) at the service door; just pull up in the driveway and ring the doorbell. A volunteer or staff person will help you.

We appreciate your donations! It keeps the book sale running, and funds new books and other purchases by the library.

Thank you to our book sale volunteers and generous donors! (Speaking of volunteers, we finally found the backup Treasurer we've been looking for).

Here are some of our more interesting financial highlights... so far this fiscal year (July '22 through June '23) our fundraising (mostly the book sale) and donations total \$25,032. We've purchased \$32,689 worth of books and digital media for the library. We've spent \$1,991 on special programs in the library, most for children.

Literacy Services, in turn, raises funds each year by a great community event, the Trivia Bee. This year, Trivia Bee was held on Oct 14 at Sierra Nevada Big Room, and CFOL was a part of the event's success.



There were two three-person teams at the Trivia Bee sponsored by CFOL, and one of them was a prize-winner. The BIBLIOMANIACS (composed of Nancy Leek, Jean Ping and Luke Sarcona) took third prize. CFOL's other sponsored entry was the BEE'S KNEES. The team entry fees, including the two paid by CFOL, are a major part of the event's income, along with individual attendance and raffle income.
