We fund the purchase of books and media to improve the library's shelves and online choices (\$53,630 in the fiscal year, which began July 1), and supporting library programs and improvements (\$9,375). This is possible largely because CFOL is doing well at the book sales (\$32,628 revenue since 7/1/22).

Thank you to the new members who join CFOL every month. We've had some very generous membership and memorial donations in our current fiscal year (thank you!). But gifts are down compared to the previous year, as are our investments. Now, in the second half of our fiscal year, comes our annual membership-gift drive-the time to make the income figures match the expenses! Please help.

There are also benefits that you derive from your membership. All donations go toward membership and are tax deductible.

- You receive four Carrels (CFO newsletter) a year giving you news of our activities as well as an update on things going on in the library.
- You are eligible to come to the members-only First Friday Book Sale each month.
- You're invited to our annual meeting each May, with guest speakers, literary or local leaders.



Book Sale Bulletin

2022 was another successful year for the Friends of the Library Book Sale. From January to December 2022 the book sale earned on average,

over \$5,000 per month. This puts the earnings back to where they were before the pandemic and enables CFOL to give the Chico Branch Library the means to buy new books and media.

The book sale sells not only used books, but also current magazines, audiobooks, music CDs, DVDs and puzzles. The books and other items are priced to sell and the volunteers are friendly and helpful. Because of our large stock, the prices of DVDs and music CDs have been lowered to 50¢ for DVDs and 25¢ for CDs—a real bargain. Lately we have even had a "Buy One Get One Free" deal on these items, so it is a great time to stock up on movies and music. Donations of books, DVDS, magazines (and cash) are always welcome and can be dropped off any time the library is open. Thanks for making 2022 a successful year for the CFOL Book Sale!




Little Free Libraries
