State Library Grant Will Help Chico Library's Building Projects



An application from Butte County has resulted in the California State Library's granting over \$14 million dollars for building improvements at the Chico and Oroville libraries! Acting Library Director Misty Wright credits former Library Director Narinder Sufi for the successful application.

The Butte County library based

its application on a long list of needed physical upgrades and a possible limited expansion of space. Butte's grant was among more than \$172 million in Building Forward library facilities improvement grants awarded to 34 local libraries to address critical maintenance needs, improve energy efficiency and sustainability, and expand digital and physical access in 29 cities across 18 counties, the California State Library announced.

The \$172 million is part of \$489 million earmarked by the governor and the Legislature to improve libraries in the state's highest poverty areas. Of the 34 awards in this round, 85 percent improve facilities in communities experiencing poverty rates ranging from 20 percent to 52.3 percent.

Established in 1850, the California State Library is the central reference and research library for state government and the legislature.

You checked out materials both physically and online, learned to use technology to make life easier, attended library programs yourself and with family, enjoyed being in a cool library during summer and a warm library during winter, asked staff questions, enjoyed reading newspapers and magazines, visited with friends, watched a movie, used library computers and printer, purchased materials from the ongoing lobby sale, purchased from the weekly book sale, and donated books and media to the CFOL.

Cutbacks in library services are never something staff or the public enjoy. For remaining staff it makes for a more difficult work situation—doing new tasks in multiple locations in fewer hours. CFOL commends the library staff for rising to the challenge and providing outstanding quality in all that they do.

A consultancy firm, Team CivX, has been hired by Butte County to survey residents on how they value their libraries, and would feel about a tax measure dedicated to the library system. The survey will include information that lays out the context for a proposed tax measure: where the funding would go and why that funding is needed. At present, the library is drawing on one time funding only lasting through this fiscal year, which ends June 30, 2024.

CFOL is perking along. So far this fiscal year (7/1/23–6/30/24)

we've received \$29,242 more than we've spent, mostly due to an anonymous \$25,000 donation (Thank you, Anonymous!). We don't know where it came from, but we're thinking hard about how to put it to good use to benefit the library.

Large donations aside, you are renewing your memberships and making memorial donations, etc. (\$6,357). Thank you! The weekly book sale continues to be a reliable source of income (almost \$18,000). We put those dollars to good use. We buy books, movies and magazine subscriptions (\$13,586). We support the library's programs like the Summer Reading Program and other programs in the library (\$3,900). We would have been able to spend more on library programs, but the library is only open 4 days a week.

scrapbooks of events, one Chico Enterprise-Record article that really stood out to me was from July 12, 1984 when the Chico Rotary Club gifted the Chico Friends of the Library \$6,000 for new books and the first computers in the Butte County Library.

"Before being certified to use the computers, potential users must read an operation guide, sign a user responsibility statement, and be instructed in the operation of the computer by [Ron] Braziel or a volunteer on duty." "Chico Friends of the Library own the computers and will be responsible for any malfunctions or repairs.
