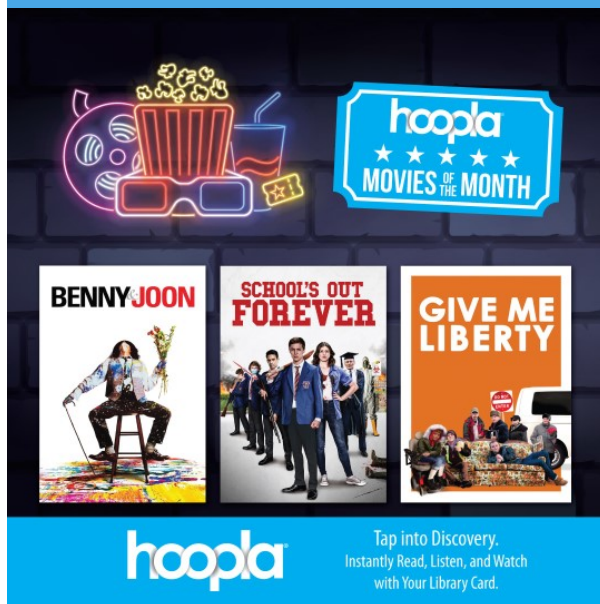

ECONOMICS: Worldwide – Shipping Delays

Online shipping has impacted the shipping industry, with increased container ships leading to delays in offloading goods around the world. The industry doesn't expect to get things straightened out until the first quarter of 2022. What was the impact of intermodal containers had on shipping and warehousing of goods? What industries are particularly vulnerable when shipping delays occur?

Search Terms: "supply chain" AND "shipping industry"

SOCIAL RELATIONS: U.S. Census

The recent release of the 2020 U.S. Census has drawn a lot of attention to the quickly changing ethnic makeup of the United States. Which ethnic groups grew the most and which group shrunk? What ethnic groups show the greatest rate of growth and shrinkage among the population under 18 years old?

Search Terms: "U.S. Census" AND "2020" AND "ethnic"

PEOPLE: Japan – Puzzle Master – Maki Kaji

Maki Kaji, who ran a puzzle magazine in Japan, was looking through an American puzzle publication in the mid-80s and spotted a game called Number Place. It was a nine-by-nine grid with some numbers prefilled in. The object of the game is to fill in all the squares with the numbers 1 through 9, each number occurring only once in each row and column. He began publishing his version of this game. It was, of course, Sudoku. How did Sudoku get that name? Who is thought to have come up with the original game? How did the game achieve worldwide popularity?

Search Terms: "Maki Kaji" AND "Sudoku"

MUSIC: Don Everly

Don Everly, along with his brother Phil, made up the very popular singing duo called the Everly Brothers who had a string of hits in the 1950s and early 1960s; the Everly Brothers were influential on generations of musicians that came after them. What kind of musical family did the Everly brothers grow up in and what forms of music influenced their unique style of singing? What country music songwriting duo wrote most of their hits and what are some of the Everly Brothers greatest hits? What musicians that came later claimed the Everly Brothers as major influences and how did the Everly Brothers impact their music?

Search Terms: "Don Everly" AND "The Everly Brothers"
